Kenya being the home of the "big five" also has the highest concentration of different species of wildlife in a given square unit of land. We say "seeing is believing", you are therefore invited to view some of the spectaculars of the wilderness in Kenya.

I wish to make a special mention that the Emperor when he was Crown Prince visited Kenya. In 2010 the Crown Prince made a state visit to Kenya. A warm welcome from the heart therefore awaits you from the people of Kenya. Get treated to the magnificent and splendor of the Kenyan wilderness.
