I am writing this email, on behalf of the KIJA Leadership Team, to bring to your attention the launching of Kenyans in Japan Association (KIJA) website and the Afro-East Investors club (http://www.kenyarep-jp.com/news/15/150602_e.html)

1. KIJA website: www.kija.co.ke

Through the efforts of KIJA Leadership, the revamped KIJA website is up and running and most of the Diaspora activities both here in Japan and elsewhere will be shared with all of us through the KIJA website. This sharing will also be done through our Facebook – [KIJA Facebook](#).
